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

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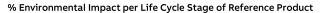




Global warming potential (GWP) - total	Indicator of potential global warming caused by emissions to air contributing to the greenhouse effect. The total global warming potential (GWP-total) is the sum of three sub-categories of climate change. GWP-total = GWP-fossil + GWP-biogenic + GWP- land use and land use change	kg CO₂ eq.
Ozone depletion (ODP)	Emissions to air that contribute to the destruction of the stratospheric ozone layer	kg CFC-11 eq.
Acidification of soil and water (A)	Acidification of soils and water caused by the release of certain gases to the atmosphere, such as nitrogen oxides and sulphur oxides	H+ eq.
Eutrophication (E)	Indicator of the contribution to eutrophication of water by the enrichment of the aquatic ecosystem with nutritional elements, e.g. industrial or domestic effluents, agriculture, etc. This indicator is divided to three: freshwater, marine and terrestrial.	kg P eq., kg N eq., mole N eq.
Photochemical ozone creation (POCP)	Indicator of emissions of gases that affect the creation of photochemical ozone in the lower atmosphere (smog) because of the rays of the sun.	kg NMVOC eq.
Depletion of abiotic resources – elements (ADPe)	Indicator of the depletion of natural non-fossil resources	kg Sb eq.
Depletion of abiotic resources – fossil fuels (ADPf)	The use of non-renewable fossil resources in an unsustainable way (e.g. from material to waste)	MJ (lower heating value)
Water Deprivation potential (WDP)	Deprivation-weighted water consumption. Assesses the potential of water deprivation, to either humans or ecosystems, building on the assumption that the less water remaining available per area, the more likely another user will be deprived.	m³ eq. depr.
